
Firebird ELIZABETH WEIN


Shadow Girl


MARCUS SEDGWICK

NON-FICTION RECOMMENDATIONS

You may be interested in exploring some of the recommendations below. However, there is such a wide variety of non-fiction texts available to you – about all sorts of topics, issues and interests – so if nothing catches your eye here, do look up books about things that interest you, or ask a teacher/librarian for advice!

What Do You Think?

MATTHEW SYED

This book will help young readers to discover what is influencing their ideas, from peer pressure to fake news. They'll learn how to form and change opinions, and how to debate their views with empathy. Readers will see how debates and disagreements can give you



new ideas, stronger friendships, and help change the world for the better. I know you have loads of incredible thoughts and ideas and the world deserves to hear your voice. I want to know... what do you think?

What is Mental Health? Where Does it Come From?

This book explains what mental health is, considering how it relates to lots of different experiences, from how we manage really big feelings, to how we get on



with each other, how we make choices and how we handle stressful situations. The book thoughtfully examines the things that can help us look after our mental health and the things that might make it feel worse. It has suggestions for the support on offer if we feel we're struggling.

Welsh (plural): Essays on the Future of Wales DARREN CHETTY

What does it mean to imagine Wales and "The Welsh" as something both distinct and inclusive? For many people, Wales brings to mind the same old collection of images – if it's not rugby, sheep and rolling hills, it's the 3 Cs: castles, coal, and choirs. Heritage, mining and the church are indeed integral parts of Welsh



culture. But what of the other stories that point us toward a Welsh future? In Welsh (Plural), some of the foremost current Welsh writers offer imaginative, radical perspectives that take us beyond the clichés and binaries that so often shape thinking about Wales and Welshness.






The Only Study Guide You'll Ever Need JADE BOWLER






DARREN SIMPSON RECOMMENDS...
