

It is a massive event which occurs every 4 years, 40,000 scouts from across the globe meet up in the chosen country for that year. Faraday Challenge

On the 3rd February, we went to the Faraday challenge, hosted by Mary Webb Science College, in Pontesbury. The Faraday Challenge is an annual competition where students can experience what it is like working with a team of engineers. We were a team of 6 students from Year 8 and the brief was to design something that could be used in a children's hospital, by either patients or staff. It had to have at least one electrical component. With this information, we created an LED system and buzzer, to indicate whether a patient did not want to be disturbed or if they were happy to have visitors. This would make patients feel more comfortable and private because hospitals are one of the many places where privacy may be sparse.



Keynote Speaker: Dr Benji Waterhouse

Award-winning comedian, writer and NHS doctor specialising in psychiatry

De Benji Waterhouse is a frontline NHS doctor specialising in psychiatry. He is also an award-winning stand-up comedian whose material provides a fly on the pudded-wall account of the mental health world and bust myths along the way (spoiler: there are no padded walls).

His writing has been published in The Guardian and The Independent and his first book, a psychiatric memoir enricked You Don't Have To Be Mad To Work Here', is being published by Vintage in Spring 2023 and adapted for screen by House Productions.

Originally graduating from Lends Medical School where he also achieved a First-Class Horn BA in Medical Ethica, he has featured in a list of 'Impiring Psychiatrises' by the Royal Gollege of Psychiatrists in 2019.








