Dear Parents & Carers,

I will start with a 'well done' to Year 11 students for their focus and hard work towards their GCSE mock exams. Whilst we absolutely hope that students will get to sit their summer external exam series, the results from these mock exams may be called upon, should we face another year where teachers need to draw on assessment results to award a teacher assessed grade. A recent survey of the year group has provided some useful feedback from students, with three things that they said stand out as most useful in preparing: using Seneca Learning; use of past exam papers and use of published revision guides. Pleasingly, all of these are available through school or, in the case of revision guides, also available to purchase from shops/online.

Thank you to the NHS team, the volunteers and staff in school who worked so efficiently on Tuesday to ensure the vaccination process for students ran smoothly. Please note that we are unable to facilitate access to vaccinations for students who did not have one in school as the process is managed by the NHS.

Finally, this week in school Mr Bird, Assistant Headteacher has led Remembrance Assemblies, followed by a 2 minute silence yesterday at 11:00am. 


Well done to William Kennaugh who was our Accelerated Reader winner for this half term. Hopefully he will spend his Amazon Voucher wisely on some new books.

Thank you to Burway Books Church Stretton who donated Marcus as a way of promoting reading but also to help to educate the students against Online Hate.




Year 11 Mock Exam revision

questionnaire

We have been busy helping Year 11 prepare for their upcoming Mock Examinations fortnight, which is due to start the week beginning 29th of November. Before half term departments compiled a list of the content that will be examined in the Mock Examinations. Dr Wood has since held a revision assembly, explaining the different revision techniques and the importance of producing a revision timetable. This was followed up by providing every student with a paper copy of a revision timetable and a reminder of where they can find the <u>revision planning resources on the school website</u>, as well as information on how to stay calm, motivated and reduce stress. Departments have been producing and collating revision resources, sharing them through OneNote and Teams, and sign posting them on Go4Schools to ensure they are at the Year 11's fingertips when they need them.

To gauge whether students had started revising, which revision resources they valued highest and give them a chance to let us know what else we could do to support their revision we carried out a Year 11 Mock Exam revision questionnaire. The key finding of which were:


80% of students have started revising, and Mr Wise, Mr Bird and Mr Overton will be working with the remaining 20% to help them get started and ensure they are motivated to achieve the absolute best marks they can.




Well over half of students have made a revision timetable and we will be encouraging all students to make use of the <u>tips on how to produce a revision timetable</u> over the next week, so that all students have a balanced and manageable revision schedule.



Most students know where to find the revision resources and the knowledge organisers that staff have worked hard to produce for all Year groups, which are an excellent resource to use as part of an active revision activity such as producing a mind map or revision cards.



We asked students to rank the different revision resources in order of how likely are to use them as part of their revision. Seneca Learning, a revision app that the school has purchased a premium package for all students to use came out on top. Seneca's smart learning algorithm helps students remember topics better. When students get a question wrong, the content will be repeated in different formats a few questions later. Past exam papers and questions came second, departments will be making past exam materials available and revision guides third. Departments still have some guides available, please contact Heads of department if you would like to purchase them for your child (if you have not already done so).



We finally asked students to let us know what else we can do to further support their revision, with the main theme being to ensure all departments are sharing similar resources.

Sharing activities on Seneca, past exam materials and another chance to buy revision guides. These suggestions and ideas have been shared with Heads of department so that they can add to the array of revision resources that they are already making available to Year 11.

The staff remain fully committed to helping all students to achieve their full potential.

A good performance in the Mock Examinations is vital and attendance is compulsory. We may be asked to provide a Teacher Assessed Grade for students who are unable to sit the GCSE exams in the Summer of 2022, as happened last year. The outcome of these Mock Examinations (raw scores) may be used to inform that judgement, so it is important to do as well as possible. We have already started a comprehensive intervention strategy and we will analyse the results of the Mock Examinations to further identify those students who need enhanced support to do so. You can support your child by encouraging them to complete a revision timetable, monitoring that they are following their plan and ensuring they are prepared for each of the exams on the Mock Examination timetable.

We wish all of Year 11 the best of luck in their Mock Examinations, although they will not need it if they fully prepare themselves with a carefully planned and well-balanced revision plan!
