Church Stretton School recently held a Safer School meeting, involving staff, a governor, the Police and myself representing Shropshire Council. It was a first class example of a Safer School meeting where we discussed security/safety. Mr Longhurst chaired the meeting and it included reviewing any incidents/issues, ensuring essential security/safety measures are effective and importantly, analysing feedback from parents/carers and students. In addition to the parent/carer response, the feedback included a survey of the students and overwhelmingly, the results were reassuring. The school has been involved in the Safer Schools initiative for some years and this meeting demonstrated the school's positive and realistic approach to security/safety – excellent work! Primary netball and dodgeball festival

On Monday 22nd November 5 local primary schools visited CSS for this event – Wistanstow, St Lawrence, Rushbury, Stokesay and Longnor.

The festival was organised by Mr Jew, Trusted Sports' Partnership Manager with the aim of re-introducing local primary schools to inter-school events at Church Stretton. 72 pupils from years' 4 – 6 took part in high 5 netball and dodgeball activities delivered by Y7 and Y10 sports leaders.

Mr Jew and Mr Barham selected 11 leaders from Year 7 to work with Mr Jew this term as part of a new Leadership Academy and they had practised delivering coaching sessions to a group of primary pupils for 2 weeks prior to the event with Mr Jew. The Year 10 leaders supported the Y7's and also refereed and umpired the friendly netball and dodgeball matches.

The event was a huge success with each school leaving with a 'School Games Value' award such as Honesty and Respect.

Miss Pinches from Wistanstow Primary said: "We all agreed it was very well organised, the leaders were engaging and encouraging. All our students were very proud of themselves, especially for the honesty certificate as this is something I encourage them to be. They will be talking about this for weeks!"

This event is the start of a programme of competitions and festivals for primary schools at Church Stretton School lasting across the remainder of the academic year.

National Grief Awareness Week 2-8 December

As a society death, dying and grief is still in the closet. Rarely if ever talked about, recognised, or supported.

It is one of society's remaining taboos. However, due to COVID no one can escape awareness of death and dying, the figures for death from Covid are on the news every night.

Those dying or losing someone from causes other than COVID may feel that their situation and circumstances have been overshadowed. Many will be grieving the loss of people who have died from a range of causes, all are equally important. This week aims to change the culture around these issues and support a move towards a more 'death literate' society.

This week aims to raise awareness of grieving; we need to recognise it is natural and not time limited. For many grief is continual and on-going, many people, children and young people in particular, find it helpful to talk about their experiences and feelings.

<u>collections</u>, which will be displayed in libraries during the week. The <u>Book Guide – Reading to help you cope with grief and bereavement</u> highlights selected titles from the collections. If you are looking for help and support during a difficult time, libraries are full of local information about these topics with compassionate and helpful staff.

During this week it is timely to draw your attention to the Shropshire bereavement pathway and highlight that it is available for anyone; staff, pupils, family, friends and colleagues who may be affected by bereavement and loss. Ringing 0345 678



9028 enables people to access counselling or bereavement support provided by a range of providers, up to six free sessions can be provided.

Church Stretton School is a trauma informed community and we encourage discussion and support across our community in relation to bereavement and helping our students to be bereavement prepared. Our tutors, pastoral and SEND teams are able to offer more specialised and bespoke support and guidance. We appreciate parents keeping us informed of family and pet bereavements so we can best support students in school.
