1. Aims

The aims of this plan are:

- To examine potential risks and issues that could cause disruption to the management and administration of exams
- To mitigate the impact of disruptions by providing actions or procedures to follow

2. Legislation and guidance

This plan complies with the <u>Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) General Regulations for Approved Centres</u>, which require all exam centres to have a written examination contingency plan/examinations policy.

This plan also complies with our funding agreement and articles of association.

3. Responsibilities

3.1 Head of centre

The head of centre is the Headteacher, John Parr. He will ensure that a written examination contingency plan/examinations policy is in place which covers all aspects of examination administration.

3.2 Staff and invigilators

Staff and invigilators involved in the centre's exam process are responsible for reading, understanding and implementing the contingency plan.

4. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the Senior Leadership Team and the Exams Officer every year in the autumn term, or well in advance of each exam series. At every review, the policy will be shared with the governing board.

5. Links with other policies

This exam contingency plan is linked to the assessment policy and the NEA assessment policy.

Disruption of teaching time – centre is closed for an extended period	When the centre is closed and candidates are unable to attend for an extended period during normal teaching or supported study time, interrupting the provision of normal teaching and learning	Seek advice from awarding organisations and JCQ Communicate with parents, carers and students about the potential for disruption to teaching time and plans to address this Have a contingency plan to facilitate alternative methods of learning, alternative venues or both Prioritise candidates who will be facing examinations shortly Advise candidates, where appropriate, to sit examinations in the next available series	Headteacher Deputy Headteacher Exams Officer

Candidates unable to take examinations because of a crisis – centre remains open	In the event that candidates are unable to attend examination centres to take examinations as normal e.g. sickness bug	Communicate with relevant awarding organisations at the outset to make them aware of the issue.
