SYNC: Stretton Youth for Nature and Climate

Last term, we started a new group in school – SYNC – to pursue a range of environmental projects and make a difference in our school and the wider community. We meet weekly, with support from Mr Parr and Mr Brannen (from St Lawrence's), and have already identified a number of ways we can improve the school's impact on the environment, including recycling, tree planting and wilding of unused areas of the school grounds. To begin, we will be holding a cake sale on Wednesday 22nd January outside the library. We will pick your teenager up from a local pick up point and they will spend the next 5 days with NCS staff and qualified instructors at an outdoor activity centre. In a team of 15, they will try their hand at a variety of outdoor pursuits ranging from rock climbing and kayaking to problem solving and challenge courses (but don't worry these are all optional). All of their meals (we cater to all dietary requirements) and accommodation are provided, and we have some amazing evening entertainment fined up for them during their stay!

Week 2 - Live Life

Your teenager will live at a university, staying in student accommodation gaining some independence.
