Dear parents and carers,

With only one week to go until the half term break, the half way point of the academic year has now been passed and for Year 11 students, there are only 50 school days until the start of the full GCSE examination series. We hope that the direct conversations with subject teachers provided useful information about how your child is progressing. Next week we wish Year 10 students and accompanying staff a safe journey and enjoyable time as they depart for their GCSE History Berlin trip. Thanks go to Miss Sollars for coordinating the trip. With the weather forecast becoming unsettled again, may I remind you of the procedures should we experience bad weather (snow!), included in this week's edition of The Link. Fingers crossed that we escape anything severe, but please do read through so that you are familiar with the procedure.

Many thanks to parents and carers for returning the forms regarding biometric information linked to Cashless Catering. We would appreciate all returns by 10th February to allow us to begin the process of registration. On the note of catering, I am extremely pleased to inform you that Shire Services are providing a refillable drinks bottle for every student. This kind gesture will allow students to re-use their bottle, filling it at home, at the dedicated 'Generation Juice' point at break and lunch time, the water fountain in the 'quad' area or at a brand new 'hydration station' offering free chilled water, kindly donated by Mr Orme of Wenlock Water. We hope to have 'Bob the bottle filler' installed in the dining hall over half term, ready for the return to school. Please see a preview later on in the Link.

I will share more details of this in due course. This is great news for us as a school, which will allow students to have a drink freely available (to be refilled at break / lunch and before or after school). As a result, we will also be able to reduce plastic waste. Therefore, please note that bottled drinks will no longer be sold on site from 24th February. Please also note that we will also be ceasing to operate the vending machines at the end of next week.

Finally this week, I am extremely pleased to provide this link to the **DfE Performance Tables** which have now been finalised. Church Stretton School sits amongst the top 6 performing secondary schools in Shropshire, with students having made above average progress in their exams last year. A fantastic achievement I am sure you will agree and one which is testament to all of the hard work and dedication of teachers, students and yourselves as parents and carers. Thank you!

Church Stretton School has received the Gold Award from our partners at the National Careers Service once again. NCS runs each summer for Yr11 students moving from school to college or apprenticeship. It involves four weeks of activities. One week away at an outward bound centre, one week away at Aberystwyth University to gain

independent living skills and then two weeks back in Shropshire working in teams on social action projects. This all culminates at a graduation event and party. The cost is only £50 which includes food, transport and all activities. All participants will gain important life skills, meet new people from schools around Shropshire (though will always be grouped with some friends from Church Stretton School if requested) and have a summer to remember. Participation in the NCS scheme is now looked at positively by colleges and universities, as well as apprenticeship providers. As well as having fun, students will enhance their life chances. The provider for NCS in this area has changed this year and a letter will come out to all Yr11's about a proposed information evening so you as parents can be better informed. 
www.churchstretton.shropshire.sch.uk before 07.00am whenever possible.
