### Writing instrument recycling in school

A new recycling project for writing instruments has been started in school. Recycling boxes are now located in the W block classrooms and the computer room – this will be expanded to other areas in the school over the coming weeks. All writing instruments (except for wooden pencils and chalk) can be recycled into these boxes. This includes any brand of pen, felt tip, highlighter, marker, correction fluid pot, correction tape, mechanical pencil and eraser pen, regardless of their composition. We cannot accept glue sticks, wooden pencils, chalk, erasers, rulers or other cutting objects that could disturb the recycling process. Students are encouraged to bring used writing instruments from home, and parents are welcome to collect from workplaces too. This, and other schemes that we plan to introduce, will raise funds for local schools and charities. We will be having another BAKE SALE on Wednesday 11th March outside the library. Our last sale raised a fantastic £108.58, which will go a long way to putting in place further schemes. # Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

### How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause fu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

- you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- If you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas


