Dear Parents/Carers,

It was lovely to welcome pods of Year 10 students back to school this week. Students were absolutely fantastic, quickly adapting to the revisions we have made for the safety of all. It was lovely to chat to them as they waited patiently, socially distanced, outside the school in the morning. We hope that the sessions delivered by specialist teachers were useful and allowed them to reflect on where they have got up to and where they are going next with their maths, English and science. Next week we look forward to their return, again in the same pods and on the same day, for some exposure to some Pathways subject teaching, along with some more English.

Meanwhile, remote learning has been supplemented with some live lesson support. Thank you for your patience as we worked hard to get this right. We have received countless messages of support and gratitude which have been passed on to staff - thank you! As more students return to teach students on school site, live lesson support will be offered in between work that is set to complete through Go4Schools, as staff cannot, of course, provide MS Teams lesson support when they are teaching students in school, but we will work hard to strike the right balance.

Finally, there are many questions about schools and September that we are not yet able to answer, as we find out at the same time as everyone, through the Government press releases. There is much speculation about the Prime Minister's pledge that all students will return in September and how this will work safely. We are expecting further clarification for schools next week about this and the Government's expectations for September. Of course, this leaves an extremely short amount of term time to react and implement any new measures. We will do our best to communicate what we know to you, so that your child has an idea about what September schooling might involve.

Online Learning -

Update

The staff have risen to the challenge of teaching in a new way this week, delivering over 40 video lessons to students across all Year groups, in addition to providing English, Maths and Science face to face lessons for Year 10 pupils in school. They have been putting the training they completed last week to great effect and have even picked up some tips from the students! The behaviour and engagement of the students who have participated in the video lessons this week has been fantastic. It has been a pleasure to deliver the video lessons and staff have appreciated the thanks students have left in the chat section of the virtual classrooms at the end of their lessons.

We value feedback of all kinds from parents, carers and students and view it as the best way to improve the service we provide. Whilst constructive criticism is always welcome, it is also nice to hear when we are getting things right as it helps us to focus on providing more of the same and gives us a much-appreciated boost. We received the following email this week which I am sure put a smile on all the faces of the Staff.

"Hello,

Just a quick email to say how much my son is enjoying the new Teams lessons.

I appreciate (from hours of zoom work meeting) that the teachers presenting to an audience they can't see and gain much feedback from, must be difficult and exhausting- however I just wanted to let you know they are totally brilliant and much appreciated.

My son is very engaged and enjoying them and totally positive afterwards and it's a welcome change.

So thank you."

We will not be resting on our laurels, however, and fully intend to continue to develop the number of video lesson opportunities we offer students over the coming weeks. Next week will see the introduction of video Tutor meetings for students in Years 7, 8 and 9 via Teams, each Year group will be invited to a meeting on different days. Year 7 will be invited to meet with their Tutors on a Monday, Year 8 on a Tuesday and Year 9 on a Wednesday, all Tutor meetings will take place at 11:30 am, unless the Tutor is involved in a Year 10 face to face or video lesson. Tutors will do their best, in this case, to rearrange the meeting for another suitable day and time. The meetings will be an opportunity for Tutors to catch up with their Tutees, discuss how they are, what they have been doing during lockdown and their experiences of video lessons.

To ensure that the use of Teams for video lessons remains a positive and worth-while experience for all users we have asked students to read the guidance that is directly related to their use of Teams and then indicate that they understand the consequences of not abiding by what is deemed to be acceptable use via an online form. We have also sent a letter to all Parents/Carers to ask them to read the Student and Parent acceptable use guidance, indicate that they have read the guidance and provide permission for their child(ren) to participate in the Teams video lessons using the online form, which can be found by clicking on this <u>link</u>.

We look forward to another exciting and successful week of video lessons next week; a copy of the timetables that we will continue to follow for video lessons is provided below and we will offer additional lessons when we are able to.
