As we reach the final 3 weeks of the summer term, planning is well under way for September 2021. In a 'normal' school year, we would have relatively straightforward thoughts about the return for students and staff in September. However, given the ongoing uncertainties and at this stage, nothing from the DfE about year group 'bubbles' no longer being required, we are anticipating that many of our current ways of working might still need to remain. We will aim to share draft plans as soon as possible, but it may be later than usual as we await guidance. Thank you for your patience, therefore.

Meanwhile, with support of TrustEd Schools' Partnership, we are pleased to be making many immediate and ongoing improvements to school, and therefore for students and staff. For example, following the upgrade of dining area seating for students last year, we are now awaiting delivery of a further set of dining tables with built in seating which will replace the current tables and chairs in 'The Place' (the red dining hall). This will provide a much better dining accommodation for students and make setting up and cleaning more efficient. We are also excited to have invested a significant sum in classrooms to support teaching & learning in the form of 15 state of the art digital touch screen boards, to be installed ready for September 2021, complementing the superb 3 'class sets' of wireless Chromebooks, housed in portable laptop trolleys already being used by our students around school. Our improved and more robust wireless network has meant that such an investment in ICT is now possible to improve the experience for our students.

## Silver Award

Last weekend, our Silver group completed their practice expedition. The expedition took place between Church Stretton and Much Wenlock developing the students' navigational skills ready for the big one, the 'Brecon Beacons' in a few weeks' time.

The expedition took place over three days staying at two different campsites. Each day students navigated around 15-18km and with the weather a little cooler, made for ideal walking conditions, but that doesn't take into account the change in elevation through their journeys.

Two separate campsites meant that students needed to pack slightly differently, selecting food which was nutritional, yet light weight, compact and that would have a long enough shelf life, whilst carrying enough clothes to ensure they were prepared for varying weather conditions, whilst thinking about their weight of their rucksack at all times.

Students were required to cook a substantial meal, pitch their tents and this expedition brought the added challenging of carrying all your equipment having used it the day before. Students overcame all their challenges, from hidden stiles overgrown with nettles, or overly heavy rucksacks to muddy slurry paths.

Well done to all students involved, you are more than ready for the main event.

In preparation for their assessed expedition students are now finalising their routes and route cards which will then be passed onto their assessors for approval.

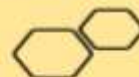


### Work Experience
