

Brief: Design and make a zipped PENCIL CASE with a monster mouth!

Specifications:
 It must be a small, strong case which is easy to carry around.
 The style will be an oval shape in bright colours, with a zip and eyes.
 It must include at least 2 different textile techniques, like batik and machine sewing.
 It must be made from an environmentally friendly fabric like cotton, that can be recycled.

Instructions:
 1. Using coloured paper, cut out some wavy shapes.
 2. Overlap the edges and stick them down with pritt.

Remove Wax

1: Iron your batik inside some newspaper.

Finished? Have you done your Driving Test?

Pin & Cut Fabric using Templates

2: Pin template onto fabric and cut out.

Point the pins towards the fabric edge.

Cut carefully around the template, **avoiding pins!**

Adding the Zip Mouth

front

back

1. Insert pins on one side of the zip only.
 2. Sew a line of straight stitch on the machine.
 3. Remove pins and repeat the machine stitching on this side.

4. Cut through the fabric between the lines of stitching.

5. Fold edges back and iron them flat.

6. On the front, sew over the straight stitch with zigzag stitch

Adding the Felt Horns

3x felt horns

(back piece)

1. Put the front and back together **INSIDE OUT!**
 2. Tuck in the 3 felt horns. Pin.
 3. Straight stitch all around the outer edge. **HALF OPEN ZIP!**
 4. Turn the pencil case through to the correct side.
